These selections beautifully express love, reparation, and trust in the Sacred Heart, drawing the faithful into more profound worship and love of Jesus - hymns and prayers to the Sacred Heart have long been cherished in the Irish Church's tradition and so we hope that these foster reverence and contemplation especially when done in front of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

We trust that these will enrich moments of prayer and inspire a renewed love for His Most Sacred Heart to those in your communities. Thank you for your dedication to fostering devotion among the faithful. May the Sacred Heart of Jesus bless you and your diocese abundantly.

Words Of The Sacred Heart To St Margaret Mary

On June 6th, 1675:

'Behold this Heart which has so loved men that It has spared nothing to testify Its love for them, even to the exhausting and consuming Itself for their sakes; but in return I receive from the greater majority of mankind nothing but ingratitude, through the contempt, irreverences, sacrileges, and coldness with which I am treated in the Sacrament of My love. However, what afflicts Me most is that those who are consecrated to Me do Me this wrong.



Promises Made By Our Lord Jesus Christ

To St Margaret Mary, in favour of those who practise and promote devotion to His Sacred Heart

- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
- 2. I will give peace to their families.
- 3. I will console them in all their troubles.
- 4. They shall find in My Heart an assured refuge during life, and especially at the hour of death.
- 5. I will pour abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners shall find in My Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall speedily rise to great perfection.
- 9. I will bless the homes in which the image of My Sacred Heart shall be exposed and honoured.
- 10. I will give priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Those who propagate this devotion shall have their name written in My Heart, and it shall never be effaced.
- 12. I promise thee, in the excess of the mercy of My Heart, that Its all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Friday of every month, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance, and that they shall not die under My displeasure, nor without receiving their Sacraments, and My Heart shall be their secure refuge at that last hour.

Such great promises should motivate and inspire our faith to live ever more in the Sacred Heart, so as to become love. Again Pope Francis tells us in his encyclical letter on the Sacred Heart, "Everything finds its unity in the heart, which can be the dwelling-place of love in all its spiritual, mental and even physical dimensions. In a word, if love reigns in our heart, we become, in a complete and luminous way, the persons we are meant to be, for every human being is created above all else for love. In the deepest fibre of our being, we were made to love and to be loved



Short Meditation

St John tells us in his first letter that we should try to love God: because God has first loved us. In this hour Lord, we wish to enter into Your Sacred Heart, to shut the world outside that often makes our hearts feel tired, so tired that it makes the strife seem endless. Day after day the restlessness of the hustle and bustle of modern day living easily makes life feel wearisome for us. Your Sacred Heart invites us to come to lay our burdens down at Your feet, to place all that oppresses us in Your Sacred Heart and to shut the world outside. Let us enter into Your Divine Heart, O Lord, to spend this hour with You, as we seek to make atonement with our acts of faith, hope, love, and acts of amendment. In this way we make up, as much as is in our power to do so, for the ingratitude and coldness of which You complained. As we make our offerings to You, O Sacred Heart, we ask that You unite our hearts with Yours. We need this union for this is where all hearts are renewed, in 'a heart to Heart encounter with Christ'. This is what Pope Francis says we are to have in this Jubilee Year (*Dilexit Nos*) and he says that 'instead of running after superficial satisfactions and playing a role for the benefit of others, we would do better to think about the really important questions in life. Who am I, really? What am I looking for? What direction do I want to give to my life, my decisions and my actions? Why and for what purpose am I in this world? How do I want to look back on my life once it ends? What meaning do I want to give to all my experiences? Who do I want to be for others? Who am I for God? All these questions lead us back to the heart' (p.8); "...the heart makes all authentic bonding possible, since a relationship not shaped by the heart is incapable of overcoming the fragmentation caused by individualism. Two monads may approach one another, but they will never truly connect. A society dominated by narcissism and self-centredness will increasingly become "heartless". This will lead in turn to the "loss of desire", since as other persons disappear from the horizon we find ourselves trapped within walls of our own making, no longer capable of healthy relationships. As a result, we also become incapable of openness to God. As Heidegger puts it, to be open to the divine we need to build a "guest house" (17); 'The heart is also capable of unifying and harmonizing our personal history, which may seem hopelessly fragmented, yet is the place where everything can make sense. The Gospel tells us this in speaking of Our Lady, who saw things with the heart. She was able to dialogue with the things she experienced by pondering them in her heart, treasuring their memory and viewing them in a greater perspective. The best expression of how the heart thinks is found in the two passages in Saint Luke's Gospel that speak to us of how Mary "treasured (synetérei) all these things and pondered (symbállousa) them in her heart" (cf. Lk 2:19 and 51). The Greek verb symbállein, "ponder", evokes the image of putting two things together ("symbols") in one's mind and reflecting on them, in a dialogue with oneself. In Luke 2:51, the verb used is *dietérei*, which has the sense of "keep". What Mary "kept" was not only her memory of what she had seen and heard, but also those aspects of it that she did not yet understand; these nonetheless remained present and alive in her memory, waiting to be "put together" in her heart (19).




I see the King of Majesty and Glory; R.


Hymn (Jesus, my Lord, my God)

Most loving Jesus, out of the grateful love I bear Thee, and to make reparation for my unfaithfulness to grace, I (N.N.) give Thee my heart, and I consecrate myself wholly to Thee; and with Thy help I purpose never to sin again.

Act of Adoration

O Jesus, humbly kneeling in Thy presence, and united with all the faithful on earth and the Saints in Heaven, I adore Thee, true God and true man, here present in the Holy Eucharist. Grateful even to the very depth of my soul I love Thee with my whole heart, O Jesus, Who are infinitely perfect and infinitely lovable. Enrich me with Thy grace, so that I may never in any way offend Thee; and. thus strengthened here on earth by Thy Eucharistic Presence, may I merit to enjoy with Mary Thy eternal and blessed presence in Heaven.

St. Margaret Mary's Personal Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, to Thee I consecrate and offer up my person and my life, my actions, trials, and sufferings, that my entire being may henceforth only be employed in loving, honouring and glorifying Thee. Be Thou, O Most Merciful Heart, my justification before God Thy Father, and screen me from His anger which I have so justly merited. I fear all from my own weakness and malice, but placing my entire confidence in Thee, O Heart of Love, I hope all from Thine infinite Goodness. Annihilate in me all that can displease or resist Thee. Imprint Thy pure love so deeply in my heart that I may never forget Thee or be separated from Thee. I beseech Thee, through Thine infinite Goodness, grant that my name be engraved upon Thy Heart, for in this I place all my happiness and all my glory, to live and to die as one of Thy devoted servants. Amen.

Consecration of the Family to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Sacred Heart of Jesus, You made clear to Saint Margaret Mary Your desire of being King in Christian families. We today wish to proclaim Your most complete kingly dominion over our own family. We want to live in the future with Your life. We want to cause to flourish in our midst those virtues to which You have promised peace here below. We want to banish far from us the spirit of the world which has nothing in common with you. You shall be King over our minds in the simplicity of our faith, and over our hearts by the wholehearted love with which they shall burn for You, the flame of which we will keep alive by the frequent reception of Your divine Eucharist. Be so kind, O divine Heart, as to preside over our assemblies, to bless our enterprises, both spiritual and temporal, to dispel our cares, to sanctify our joys, and to alleviate our sufferings. If ever one or other of us should have the misfortune to afflict You, remind him, O Heart of Jesus, that You are good and merciful to the penitent sinner. And when the hour of separation strikes, when death shall come to cast mourning into our midst, we will all, both those who go and those who stay, be submissive to Your eternal decrees. We shall console ourselves with the thought that a day will come when the entire family, reunited in heaven, can sing forever Your glories and Your mercies. May the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the glorious patriarch Saint Joseph present this consecration to You, and keep it in our minds all the days of our life. All glory to the Heart of Jesus, our King and our Father!
